
#### Secretary's Message




Sundays will be Pot luck dinners. Some members who come up to the lodge bring their favorite dishes to share. If you've never been there for these you are missing good food and fellowship.

*Carnival Glory* is a <u>Con-</u> <u>quest-class cruise ship</u> and was built in 2003. Some features of the *Glory* include nightclubs, <u>duty-free</u> <u>shops</u>, four <u>pools</u>, seven <u>whirl-</u> <u>pools</u>, and a 214-foot water slide. Sixty percent of her staterooms have ocean views and sixty percent of those feature private balconies.

The Glory departs from Miami, FL on Sunday, April 24th with ports of call in Half Moon Cay, Bahamas, St. Thomas, San Juan, and Grand Turk, returning to port on Sunday May 1st.

Prices range from \$589.00 per person for an inside cabin, \$689 per person for an ocean view cabin, and \$839 per person for a cabin with balcony. Taxes regardless of cabin selection are \$106.30 per person.


