**Secretary's Message**

Welcome to the nine new Brother and Sister Elks who were initiated on March 17th. I hope we will see ALL of you at our next meeting.

As of this writing, 28 Elks have not paid their dues and will be dropped on 3/31/11. Consequently and if nothing changes we will end up with a net loss of 5 for the year for a total of 381.

As for current receipts, 44% of our members have paid their dues. Thanks to all for sending their dues in so promptly. That's a very good start and I hope this positive trend continues. However, we really need for all to pay as soon as possible as we will have to pay the GL and state association per capita fees of \$6,477 on May 1. Couple that with the \$4,000 plus insurance premium and the first 50% of dues received is already allocated for mandatory Grand Lodge expenses.

One other "required" expense is associated with our club room operations. The NC wine, beer and mixed drink permits are due April 30. The first two are \$200 each with the mixed drink permit costing \$750. I struggle with us continuing with this process and at our first meeting in April I will introduce a motion that the lodge apply for a brown bagging license. That license is only \$200 and by brown bagging instead of offering mixed drinks, this frees us from onerous record keeping rules, the cost of procuring and stocking various brands of liquor while allowing for less experienced bartenders and unpaid volunteers to work the bar. If approved, this has to be done at this meeting in order to allow time to sell our \$3000+ of liquor inventory by the end of April.

This past year's poor financial re-

sults in particular is a good enough reason in justifying that. However, I have been involved with the Lodge leadership for the past 20 years and we have ALWAYS had challenges in regulating this high cost service. I believe brown bagging will be a win/win situation for all. In addition, brown bagging allows us to bring back storage lockers where for a small fee a member or a husband and wife can keep up to 8 liters of liquor and/or wine for their use. This far less expensive approach just makes sense for a small non-profit with a weak bar business to adopt. Yes, it would initially be an inconvenience for liquor drinkers but in time it will be an opportunity to reduce our club room losses and actually entice others with lockers to patronize the lodge more frequently. 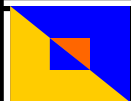
