




Secretary's Message

Remember, as an Elk this River Park belongs to ALL Elks and we ALL have a responsibility to follow River Park rules, and also to enforce the rules.


We have set up a Facebook account SALISBURY ELKS RIVER PARK. Please join this and be posted on events going on, also leave messages of what we can do better or if you can help out.
